

Why are Partnerships Important?



Why is Community Engagement Important?



To help you access federal money

• It is not uncommon in federal programs to see merit criteria specific to partnerships and demonstration of collaboration.

To develop a replicable process for future applications

 Developing a community engagement plan establishes a process that can be repeated in future applications and future city projects and plans

To establish long-term relationships

 Developing relationships with community stakeholders now will help lay the foundation for a long-term trust-based relationship to develop projects and programs with greater impact

Merit Criteria: Partnership and	Non-Responsive Application did not	Low Application contains	Medium Project has one or more of the following	High Project has, or demonstrates plans to, support and engage
Collaboration	address the Partnership and Collaboration criterion OR Project negatively affects partners or community members (e.g. negative impacts from ROW acquisition, lack of support for the project, etc.)	insufficient information to assess the partnership and collaboration benefits	partnership and collaboration benefits but partnership and collaboration may not be a primary project purpose or does not meet the description(s) of a 'high' rating: • Collaborate with public and/or private entities; or • Document support from local, regional, or national levels	diverse people and communities by doing one or more of the following: • Engage residents and community-based organizations ensure equity considerations for underserved community are meaningfully integrated throughout the lifecycle of project, for example, by citing and describing how the project aligns with the Department's Promising Practice for Meaningful Public Involvement in Transportation Decision-Making Guide; or • Coordinate with other types of projects such as econor development, commercial or residential development in public transportation, power/electric infrastructure projects, or broadband deployment; or • Partner with Disadvantaged Business Enterprises or 8(firms; or • Partner with high-quality workforce development programs with supportive services to help train, place, retain people in good-paying jobs or registered apprenticeships. These programs should have a focus of expanding access for women, people of color, and other that are underrepresented in infrastructure jobs (people with disabilities, people with convictions, etc.); or • Partner and engage with unions and/or worker organizations in the development of the project and the

- Develop a project executive summary
- Asset mapping / identification
- Goal setting





Best Practices in Developing Long-Term Relationships

- Compensate residents
- Reduce the barriers to participation
- Communicate often and through multiple channels
